Members of the Board of Directors

Duties

The members of the Board of Directors have the ultimate authority to ensure the lawful and efficient operation of the District. They are the fiduciary disciplinary body for the District and may act as the administrative board in all disciplinary hearings involving all District employees other than the Fire Chief. The Board has the authority to approve all annual budgets and expenditures, and to participate in and/or approve District annual salaries, wages and benefits.

The members of the Board of Directors set the official policy of the District. Said policies are to be mindful of the legal rights of all employees and are to be established in accordance with law.

On behalf of the District the Board may enter into contracts that are within the scope of its authority and are in the line of duty. Board members are not personally liable thereon unless it is clear by the terms of the contract that the Board members intended to bind themselves.

Any contract entered into which exceed the authority given to Board members may subject the Board members to personal liability for any contractual exposure above the level of their delegation.

Board members are expected to be familiar with the rules of the Brown Act regarding open meetings, required notice therefore, and the requirements for entering into closed session. Participation in retroactive feigned compliance with Brown Act meeting requirements could subject a Board member to criminal liability. All Board members should be aware of any issue of self-dealing and should abstain from voting on any questions in which the member has financial interest, or on those issues which could somehow affect their tenure or benefits.
